



Memory Verses from the Trail

A Chapel in the Woods activity from Papa and Baylor Go Fishing

Baylor didn't just learn how to fish—he learned how to carry something much more important. These verses remind us why sharing, kindness, and God's Word matter on the trail and in our hearts.

When we tuck God's Word into our hearts, it goes with us wherever we go—even on quiet forest trails and big adventures.

Hebrews 13:16 (KJV)


“But to do good and to communicate forget not: for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.”

What it means:

“Do good” means to be kind and helpful.

“To communicate” comes from the Greek word **koinōnía**, which means to share what you have—like time, kindness, or even a cube of cheese!

When we share and care for others, God sees it as a gift of love—a “sacrifice” that makes Him happy.

Psalm 119:11 (KJV)

“Thy word have I hid in mine heart...”

What it means:

God wants us to remember His Word deep inside—so it can guide us even when no one is watching.

When we keep His promises close, like Baylor did, we're never really alone on the trail.
